

Waterbury Youth Found Guilty In Fire Case

MONTPELIER — Bruce M. Spaulding, 18, of Waterbury, pleaded no contest in Municipal Court Monday to a breach of peace charge. He was fined \$25 and costs of \$13.10.

Judge Joseph W. Foti said that the complaint was amended by Atty. Gen. Thomas M. Debevoise. When arraigned Oct. 14, 1960, Spaulding pleaded innocent to an arson charge. Spaulding and three other Waterbury boys were accused of setting fire to the home of Mrs. Joseph Senna in Waterbury Center.

David Johnson, Robert Sayah and Alfred Tripp Jr., all 19, later pleaded guilty to the charge and were placed on probation after two-to-three year prison sentences had been suspended.
